A baby a day dies through test error

HUNDREDS of healthy babies are being aborted every year because tests to see if they have been miswired are unreliable.

As many as 400 errors are made with the procedures every year – more than the number of babies lost to cot death.

The situation is being blamed on doctors being too busy to diagnose a miscarriage and choose to carry out a second scan to resolve their findings.

Many of the operations being wrongly diagnosed would reach full term, say researchers who uncovered the problem.

Prof Tom Bourne, from Imperial College London, said: "It's the responsibility of the profession to put in place a code."

An estimated 500,000 women have miscarriages in Britain every year. Usually, doctors perform an ultrasound scan to measure the size of the gestational sac.

If it appears empty or a well-developed embryo shows no heartbeat, a diagnosis of miscarriage is made. When that is done, doctors are supposed to document the

gestational sac seven to ten days later to confirm their suspicion.

But, according to the new research into 1,000 diagnoses of miscarriage, the average of error is so high that some perfectly viable pregnancies are being lost.

It found errors could lead to 400 viable pregnancies potentially being misdiagnosed, compared with approximately 300 cot deaths reported in the UK each year.

Prof Bourne said a report was should be done ten days after the first "in all cases".

Dr Colin Duncan, from the University of Edinburgh, said: "Women should not feel pressured about seeking a second opinion."

Ruth Bender Aik, national director of the Miscarriage Association, backed the call for a second scan but added: "It is a double-edged sword for women. There is the distress and anxiety as they wait to find out but, then again, they don't want to witness a pregnancy unless they have to."

Art Review Lazarides Minotaur

Minotaur marks the second in a trilogy of subterranean redemptive experiences at The Old Vic Theatre, co-edited by Steve Lazarides, the dealer dedicated to street and 'outsider' art. Following last year's *Dark Island* and *Half Acre*, a variety of artists have created specially commissioned works for the labyrinthine space, all inspired by the myth of the Minotaur.

As you explore the 50,000 square feet of disused railway tunnels, the pieces on show range from the sublime to the wily grim.

Douglas Foster's video installation *China* evocatively shows sea-bed, wily cackling penguins created by liquids dropped into water, which are beautifully reflected in a dark pool underneath. However, you really wouldn't want to bump into David Falconer's *Vermin Death Star*, a menacing ball of

plaster, set in the gloom. Zak Orr has fashioned a beautiful installation in circular coloured glass, while ATTY's well-matched, oxidised ball *Minotaur* (pictured) is a dark talking point.

The experience is a labyrinth created by Lazarides's official artist, Steady Desmond – a mass of corrugated iron belabored with playing card-style signs covered in mysterious markings.

As you wind your way around, look by the hand's *Thou's Your mother is beneath your feet*.

As ever, that's bound to coincide with London's well-tested art fair, *Interrogata Fairs*. Minotaur showcases an alternative and profitably cool art underworld. **AD**
